Iro Mylonakou - Keke is a Professor of Social Pedagogy at the Department of Pedagogy and Primary Education (DPPE) of School of Education at the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens (NKUA) in Greece.

Academic Background

She holds undergraduate degrees (from the Marasleios Academy, the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens, and the Athens University of Economics and Business) and postgraduate degrees (from the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens), in Educational Sciences, Pedagogy, Business Organisation and Management, and Marketing.

She also has an extensive background in Music Studies and has received specialised training in Music and Movement Pedagogy.

Professional career

She has been a member of the academic staff in the Department of Pedagogy and Primary Education at the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens since 2003 and has held the rank of Full Professor since 2017.

Prior to her current appointment, she served as a Consultant at the Pedagogical Institute, as a Head of Environmental Education, and as a Primary School Teacher.

Research Activities

She has overseen and conducted a substantial number of research programmes, both national and international, in collaboration with universities and academic institutions abroad.

Her research has led to the development and publication of the following three Epistemological and Research Models:

A) <u>Transdisciplinary Social Pedagogic Model / "Syn-epistemic Wholeness"</u> [This model focuses on the dialectical synergies among scientific disciplines, epistemologies, methodologies, research strategies, practices, ways of learning and knowledge, as well as among scientists, researchers, and all stakeholders involved in the learning and research process].

B) Social Pedagogical Intervention Model for Refugee families by Students / SPIM4ReSt Model

[This model emphasises the emotional and social education and support of socially vulnerable groups, carried out by university students. It was developed in the context of a three-year social pedagogical programme implemented for refugee populations, including unaccompanied minors and families, by trained volunteer student groups from the Department of Primary Education, National and Kapodistrian University of Athens. These students undertook a systematic and specialised training programme prior to their involvement].

C) **Syneducation Model**

[This Model promotes interactive education, mutual mentoring, and collaborative learning between children and adults. The term "Syneducation" (a synthesis of "synergy" and "education") was coined in 2005, in collaboration with Ioannis Kekes].

> Academic Teaching Experience

She has been teaching modules aligned with her research interests for several years, both at undergraduate and postgraduate level at the NKUA, as well as other higher education institutions with which she collaborates.

As part of the undergraduate and postgraduate modules in Social Pedagogy that she delivers, she designs and coordinates -leveraging interdisciplinary collaborations- Experiential Workshops and Practical Training Placements for students. These are implemented in primary and secondary schools, as well as in socio-pedagogical institutions, involved in formal and non-formal education, healthcare provision, and psychosocial support.

These Practical Training Placements include correctional facilities, governmental and non-governmental organisations, agencies specialising in human resource management, psychosocial well-being, neuro-social counselling, lifelong learning, and professional development, as well as institutions engaged in educational, social, and medico-pedagogical frameworks, among others.

Through the systematic integration of theory and practice, and by employing a range of participatory and collaborative methods and techniques, these Practical Training Placements significantly contribute to the enhancement and expansion of social pedagogical applications and capacities. At the same time, they foster the development and reinforcement of students' skills and competences, nurtured within a framework of pedagogical, social, and ethical responsibility.

- Founder and Director (since 2015) of the Master's Programme "Social Neuroscience, Social Pedagogy and Education", the first of its kind in Greece [a joint initiative of the Department of Pedagogy and Primary Education (DPPE), the School of Medicine, and the Department of Biology at the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens (NKUA)], which she continues to lead. The Programme investigates and applies inter- and transdisciplinary synergies across these fields.
